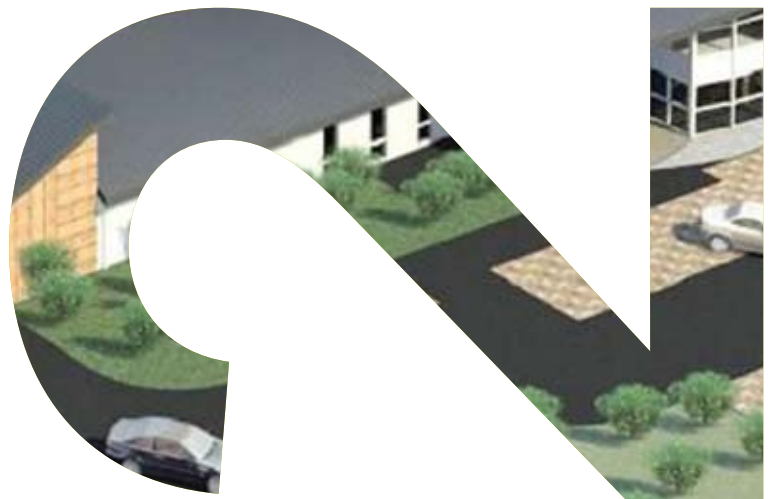

Currently caring for over 700 service users across facilities in Northampton, Essex and Birmingham, 2010 now marks the opening of two new centres of excellence offering further provision to an additional 200 people. This growth sees the charity moving increasingly closer to realising its vision of 2000 beds by 2020.

Set within the heart of the charity's Northampton campus, our impressive 132 bed medium secure facility will provide some of our most specialist services to date including:

Deaf Service

Young Adult Transitional Service

New Deaf service

People who are deaf have increased rates of mental health problems and are over-represented in secure hospitals and prisons. The current provision of specialist deaf forensic services is limited and is concentrated in the north-west of England.

Our new deaf medium secure service will provide high-quality care in a linguistically and culturally appropriate environment. British Sign Language (BSL) will be the first language of the service. Its geographical positioning will make it easier for deaf patients from the south of the country to maintain links with their home area. The service has been developed in partnership with leading deaf charities.



A new approach to care for younger adults

Created to overcome the challenges often faced by vulnerable individuals when moving from adolescent to adult services, our Young Adult Transitional Service will provide a seamless and supportive progression through their care pathway.

Medium secure Acquired Brain Injury facility

Building on 30 years experience and expertise at our National Brain Injury Centre, the new 17 bed medium secure unit will provide early intervention following an acquired brain injury, to maximise positive impact on rehabilitation.

Supporting the service user

A range of onsite facilities are provided to support our clinical treatment programmes and embrace the service user's social, cultural and recreational needs. These include GP and dental care, therapy areas offering crafts, IT skills and vocational projects, a stylish cafe, gym, library, hairdressers, swimming pool and garden. Spiritual needs are provided for by a multi faith room and pastoral service.

Opens September 2010

St Andrew's Nottinghamshire will provide the services the charity is well known for to service users in the East Midlands and neighbouring areas.

We recognise that having easy access to quality mental health care services closer to home plays a vital role in recovery. St Andrew's Nottinghamshire provides a unique combination of services responding directly to the needs of individuals from the East Midlands and surrounding areas.

This development adds to our complement of regional centres providing treatment for service users in their local community.

The purpose built 70 bed facility will provide services for men aged 18-65 across medium and low secure levels, for those with learning disability, and or Autistic Spectrum Conditions.
