Kemsley, National Centre for Brain Injury Rehabilitation at St Andrew's Healthcare in Northampton has over 25 years of experience in brain injury rehabilitation and, in conjunction with the University of Northampton School of Health, is now pleased to offer you an opportunity to study on one of our modular courses:

**Brain Injury Awareness (Level 2)
or
Brain Injury Management (Level 3)**

The mode of assessment will differ depending on whether candidates access this course at Diploma level (Level 2) or Degree level (Level 3).

This innovative course, which is unique to Kemsley and the University of Northampton, covers a wide range of key brain injury issues.

Aims

The aim of the course is to provide people working with brain injured adults the opportunity to increase their understanding and knowledge of a number of key issues in relation to the rehabilitation, treatment and management of brain injured individuals.

The module aims to explore the nature and consequences of non-progressive acquired brain injury for the individual concerned, their family, significant others and society at large. A range of treatments and rehabilitation issues will be critically examined to provide course members with a sound knowledge base from which they can develop within their area of practice.

The module will have an inter-disciplinary focus at all times in order to reflect the complex nature of brain injury and to explore the need for inter-disciplinary professional approaches to care, treatment and rehabilitation.

Candidates

The course is designed for any person, registered or non-registered, working within the field of brain injury, whether they are working within hospitals, community based units, for voluntary services or in paid employment.

To access either of these modules, you need to be working within a brain injury setting and meet the academic minimum entry requirements, as the course is designed to enable the student to apply theory learned in the classroom environment to their own work environment with their current client group. Candidates will be expected to submit two assignments which they will need to pass, to be awarded the CATS points.

Lecturers

The course has been designed, and will be delivered, by an inter-professional team. Lecturers will include experienced Kemsley based staff together with invited external speakers with specialist knowledge.

Venue, Duration and Cost

The course will be held at Kemsley and is designed to take place one day a week over 20 weeks, inclusive of 12 study days scheduled for:

11, 18 and 25 September

9, 16 and 30 October

6, 13 and 20 November

4 December

8 and 15 January 2009

Submission date – 22 January 2009

The cost of the course is £650.00 per student.
