


# Speech and Language Therapy in action: making a difference

Lego Therapy	Laura Watling, Highly Specialist SLT & Jenny Hage, SLT	
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This workshop will offer a brief overview of the Lego Therapy approach and some practical guidance as to how this has been implemented in St Andrews secure services, across adult learning disabilities, autism spectrum disorders and acquired brain injury populations. Ideas for goal setting and measuring progress will be discussed. Participants will also have the opportunity to try building some models using the Lego Therapy roles.

Women's Service Occupational Therapy and SLT Jacki Roberts, OT Technical Instructor & Emma Reynolds, SLT Assistant

Allied Health Professions are leading the way in transforming services by working together to support people to make informed choices about their own care and promote independence. Speech and language therapy and occupational therapy have worked collaboratively on a number of small scale, patient centred resources to maximise patient involvement, improve patient outcomes and improve physical and mental health care within a secure learning disability service. This workshop will demonstrate the benefits of collaborative practice.

CAMHS: Emotional Awareness—Thoughts, Feelings and Behaviours Emma Clark, Senior Assistant Psychologist & Carol Reffin, Head of SLT

This workshop will provide insight into the work we do to support adolescent young women with learning disabilities that present with emotional dysregulation. The main focus of the workshop will be to look at the Emotional Awareness Group which is jointly delivered by SLT and psychology. There will be an opportunity to hear feedback from the young people, explore the findings from pre and post intervention measures and gain a better understanding of the emotional needs of this client group.

Speech and Language therapists in Dementia care: sharing is caring Una Montgomery, Highly Specialist SLT & Hannah Boyes, Specialist SLT

This practical workshop provides the opportunity to explore current priorities in dementia care and how speech and language therapists can build upon these to enhance services for people with dementia. Participate in open discussions, interactive activities and reflect on best practice with the aim to share innovative practice and improve our patients' care.
